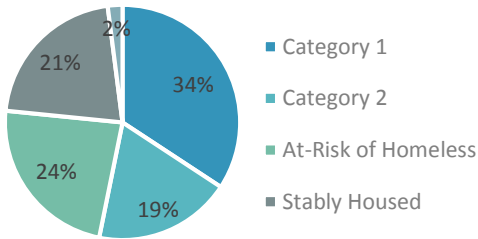

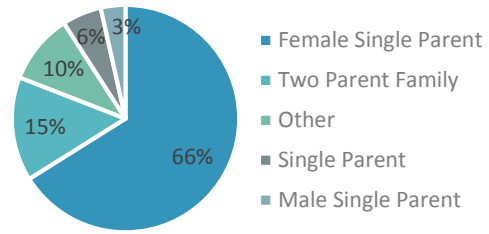

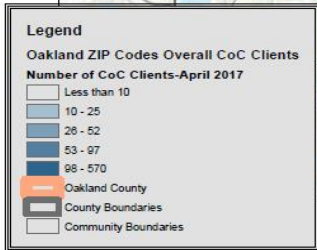
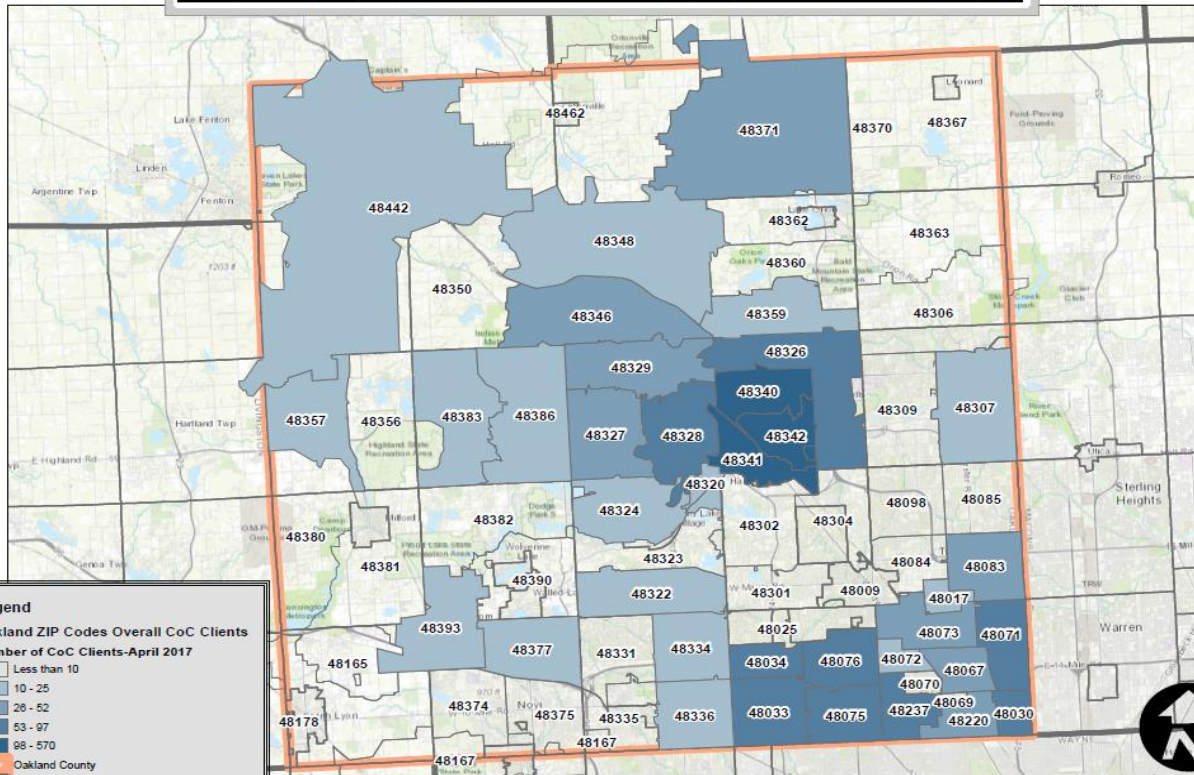
Housing Status



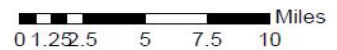
Household Type



Oakland County ZIP Codes with CoC Clients

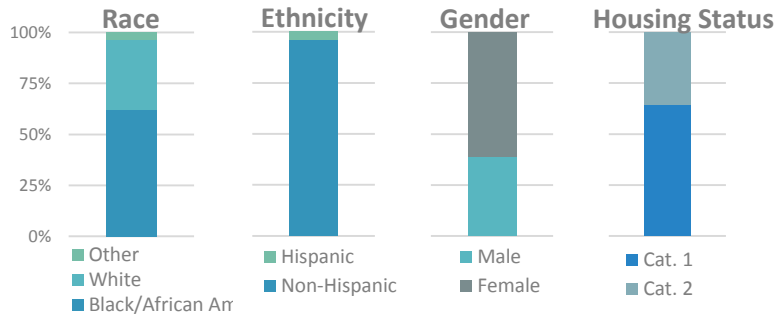

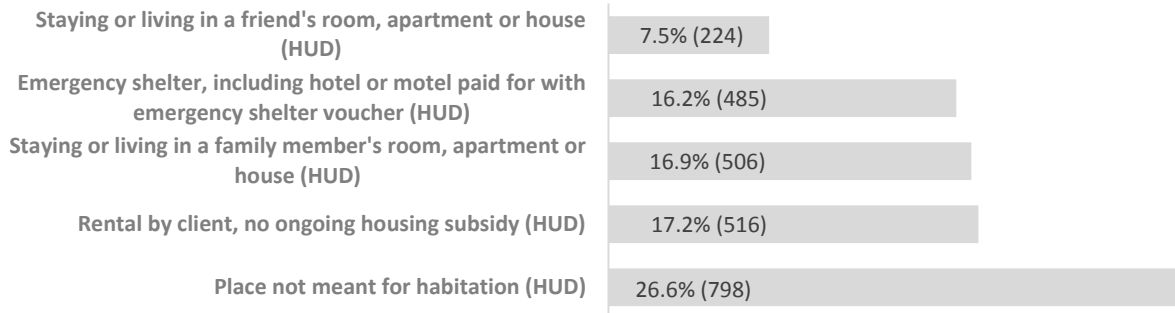

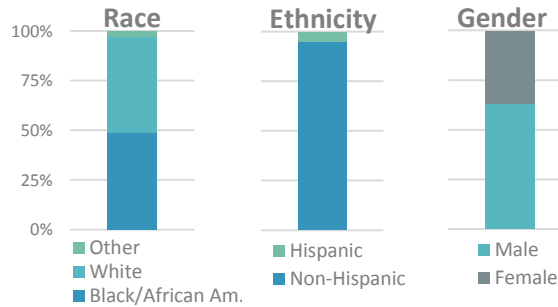


Top Prior Living Situation

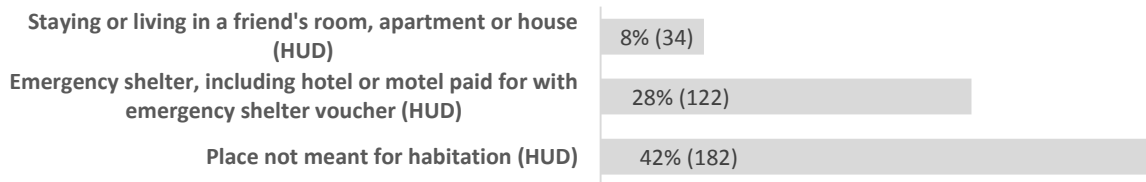

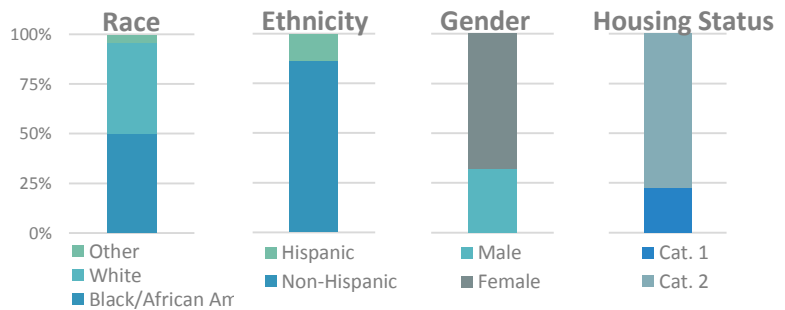


Top Prior Living Situation

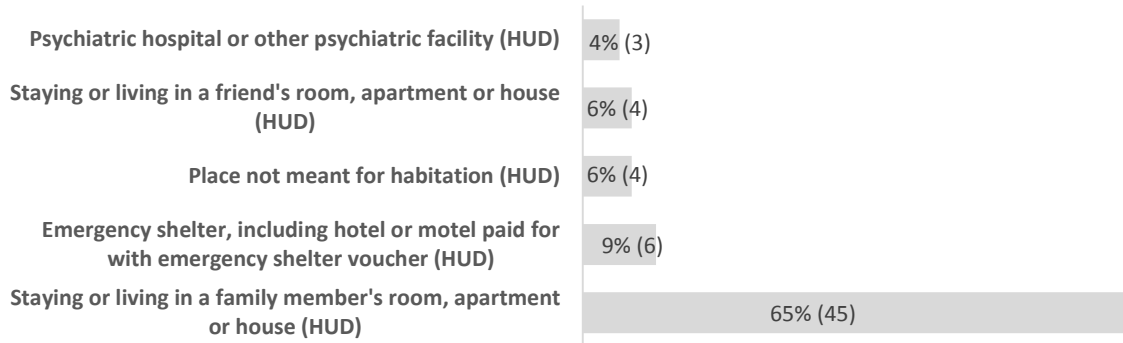

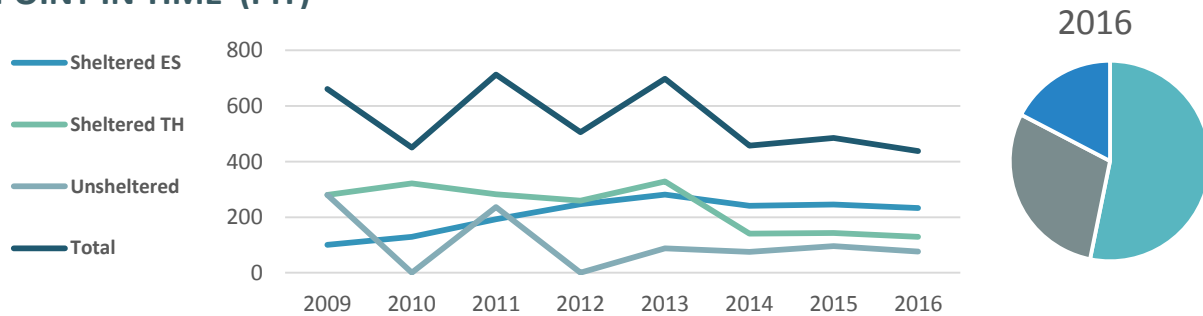
