

Before Starting the Project Listings for the CoC Priority Listing

The FY 2017 CoC Consolidated Application requires TWO submissions. Both this Project Priority Listing AND the CoC Application MUST be submitted prior to the CoC Program Competition deadline as required by the FY 2017 CoC Program Competition NOFA.

The FY 2017 CoC Priority Listing includes the following:

- Reallocation forms – must be fully completed if the CoC is reallocating eligible renewal projects to create new projects as described in the FY 2017 CoC Program Competition NOFA.
- New Project Listing – lists all new project applications created through reallocation and the permanent housing bonus that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- Renewal Project Listing – lists all eligible renewal project applications that have been approved and ranked or rejected by the CoC.
- UFA Costs Project Listing – applicable and only visible for Collaborative Applicants that were designated as a Unified Funding Agency (UFA) during the FY 2017 CoC Program Registration process. Only 1 UFA Costs project application is permitted and can only be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant.
- CoC Planning Project Listing – Only 1 CoC planning project is permitted per CoC and can only be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant.
- HUD-2991, Certification of Consistency with the Consolidated Plan – Collaborative Applicants must attach an accurately completed, signed, and dated HUD-2991.

Things to Remember:

- All new and renewal projects must be approved and ranked or rejected on the Project Listings.
- Collaborative Applicants are responsible for ensuring all project applications are accurately appearing on the Project Listings and there are no project applications missing from one or more Project Listings.
- If a project application(s) is rejected by the CoC, the Collaborative Applicant must notify the affected project applicant(s) no later than 15 days before the CoC Program Competition application deadline outside of e-snaps and include the reason for rejection.
- For each project application rejected by the CoC the Collaborative Applicant must select the reason for the rejection from the dropdown provided.
- If the Collaborative Applicant needs to amend a project application for any reason after ranking has been completed, the ranking of other projects will not be affected; however, the Collaborative Applicant MUST ensure the amended project is returned to the applicable Project Listing AND re-rank the project application BEFORE submitting the CoC Priority Listing to HUD in e-snaps.



Alliance for Housing

Alliance for Housing CoC Planning Grant

The Alliance for Housing is requesting **\$169,154** for planning assistance for the Oakland CoC. This project will assist in funding the activities of the Executive Director for the Alliance for Housing, Oakland County Michigan Continuum of Care. This position will report directly to the Alliance for Housing, Board of Directors, the decision making body for the Oakland County CoC. The principal duties and responsibilities of the Executive Director will include but not be limited to:

1. Coordinating the implementation of the 2017 updated Oakland County Strategic Plan to End Homelessness. This will include: a) Development of a repeatable process to assess and measure the performance (outcomes versus targets) of the Continuum of Care in implementing the Strategic Plan, b) Development of a repeatable process for communicating the performance (Outcomes) of the CoC in implementing the Strategic Plan and the process of addressing poor performing activities, and c) Develop a repeatable process for annual or semi-annual reviews of The Strategic Plan ensuring it is in line with Continuum goals and identified unmet needs.
2. Initial and ongoing assessment of the quality of coordination and integration of homeless services and service providers in the Continuum of Care planning process and b) development of a schedule of regular coordination activities and communications between Continuum of Care service providers and those community institutions serving homeless and those at risk of homelessness including low income families and individuals. The community institutions and the services they provide include but not limited to community corrections, mental and physical health care, foster care, veterans, youth and other deemed critical to serving the targeted populations.
3. Assess the effectiveness of the Continuum of Care's Supportive Housing and Emergency Solutions grant programs measuring their effectiveness against set targets of the strategic planning goals. Report these measurements to the Alliance for Housing Board of Directors and coordinate adjustments, seek technical assistance or make recommendations on outcome and quality improvement. Included with this task is the development of a documented and repeatable procedure for grant evaluation to be included in the ongoing Strategic Plan process.

Graduated Apartment Program II

Common Ground is requesting **\$242,752** for the Graduated Apartment Program II. The program will provide ***young people, male and female, ages 18 through 24, and their children when appropriate***, transitional housing, case management, counseling and life skill trainings for a successful transition from life on the streets and homelessness, to self-sufficiency in permanent and stable housing.

The renewal includes six (6) single-bedroom units, and ten (10) two-bedroom units, for a total of sixteen (16) subsidized units. The Community Housing Network, Inc. (CHN) is requesting a renewal of **\$163,143** for one year to continue the funding permanent supportive housing through the leasing of scattered site rental units throughout Oakland

County. This renewal includes eleven (11) single-bedroom units, and three (3) two-bedroom units for a total of 14 subsidized units. The program provides rental assistance and access to supportive services for individuals (and their families) that are homeless and affected by severe and persistent mental illness and/or developmental disabilities. Renewal funding will pay for rental subsidies, Housing Quality Standards Inspections, supportive services (staff salary), and operating costs.

Community Housing Network Formerly Common Ground Leasing Assistance Program

The Community Housing Network, Inc. (CHN) is requesting a renewal of **\$139,245** for the Leasing Assistance Program, which was previously operated by Common Ground. The program will provide homeless ***adult males and females, ages 18 and older, and their children when appropriate***, who are defined by HUD to have a disability with subsidized housing and housing case management. The goal of the program is to reach clients where they are and help them develop a greater level of self-sufficiency. The renewal includes six (6) single-bedroom units, five (5) two-bedroom units, and two (2) three-bedroom units for a total of 13 subsidized units

Clients are provided ongoing supportive case management services to maintain their housing option within the laws of the state and their lease agreement. The case manager works with landlords on behalf of a client to assist in troubleshooting issues as they arise, provide tutorials on housing safety, maintenance and cleanliness, coordinate care with their mental health provider for issues that may threaten housing, and/or assist in finding more permanent housing options when the clients is ready to graduate. As a result of the mental health needs of the clients, additional professional services are leveraged from the core provider agencies of the OCCMHA system to provide case management, counseling and skill building. Further services include the support for accessing mainstream resources such as Social Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Income (SSD) benefits and legal assistance through the agency legal clinic.

Community Housing Network Rapid Re-Housing

The Community Housing Network, Inc. (CHN) is requesting a renewal of **\$80,665** for its Rapid Re Housing program. This funding will provide for rapid re-housing (RRH) short and/or medium-term rental assistance activities to 30 households over a one year period. CHN will provide RRH housing assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services to eligible homeless households with children who are literally homeless and earning less than 30% of the area median income.

Community Housing Network Rapid Re-Housing 2

The Community Housing Network, Inc. (CHN) is requesting a new project for **\$83,876** for its Rapid Re Housing program. This funding will provide for rap-

id re-housing (RRH) short and/or medium-term rental assistance activities to 30 households over a one year period. CHN will provide RRH housing assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services to eligible homeless households with children who are literally homeless and earning less than 30% of the area median income.

Community Housing Network Rapid Re-Housing 3

The Community Housing Network, Inc. (CHN) is requesting a renewal project for **\$393,759** for its Rapid Re Housing program. This funding will provide for rapid re-housing (RRH) short and/or medium-term rental assistance activities to 30 households over a one year period. CHN will provide RRH housing assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services to eligible homeless households with children who are literally homeless and earning less than 30% of the area median income.

Community Housing Network Oakland Chronically Homeless Leasing Assistance Program 5

The Community Housing Network, Inc. (CHN) is requesting new bonus project of **\$105,073** for one year to fund permanent supportive housing through the leasing of scattered site rental units throughout Oakland County. This application includes three (3) single-bedroom units, two (2) two-bedroom units, and one (1) three-bedroom unit, for a total of 6 subsidized units. The program provides rental assistance and access to supportive services for individuals (and their families) that are homeless and affected by severe and persistent mental illness and/or developmental disabilities. Renewal funding will pay for rental subsidies, Housing Quality Standards Inspections, supportive services (staff salary), and operating costs.

Lighthouse PATH

Lighthouse PATH, a subsidiary of Lighthouse of Oakland County, is devoted to the elimination of homelessness, a key issue with many families that are struggling with poverty in Oakland County. Lighthouse PATH is an empowerment program for women and children that provide a safe, structured environment for up to 66 homeless women and their children. Of this total, 56 units are for adult women and their children and 10 units are for pregnant and parenting teens. Typically these clients are referred by temporary emergency shelters, with many of the referrals coming from the HAVEN emergency shelter for survivors of domestic violence. Program participants are offered a safe place to live, comprehensive case management, health care, child care, individual and group counseling, and a variety of life skills classes such as parenting, budgeting, and personal life management. In addition, all clients are offered financial literacy classes, financial coaching, career development and job placement services. By providing individual and group coun-

selling, life skills classes and the opportunity to get involved in job training, working or completing their education, the PATH program helps these individuals to become self-sufficient and to find permanent housing.

Lighthouse PATH

Pontiac Houses & Apartments

Lighthouse PATH is requesting **\$238,428** for Pontiac Apartments for transitional housing for homeless women and children. Program participants are offered a safe place to live, comprehensive case management, health care, child care, individual and group counseling, and a variety of life skills classes such as parenting, budgeting, and personal life management. The renewal includes eight (8) single-bedroom units, sixteen (16) two-bedroom units, and four (4) four-bedroom units for a total of 28 subsidized units

In addition, all clients are offered financial literacy classes, financial coaching, career development and job placement services. By providing individual and group counseling, life skills classes and the opportunity to get involved in job training, working or completing their education, the PATH program helps these individuals to improve their self-sufficiency and find permanent housing

Lighthouse PATH

Rapid-Re-Housing

Lighthouse PATH is requesting **\$131,289** for a renewal project with reallocation of funds – For the new Rapid Re-housing Program, the maximum length of stay would be 6 months and Lighthouse proposes to serve a minimum of 20 households. This funding will provide for rapid re-housing (RRH) short and/or medium-term rental assistance activities. Lighthouse PATH RRH housing assistance and housing relocation and stabilization services to eligible homeless households with children who are literally homeless and earning less than 30% of the area median income.

Lighthouse PATH

Teen

Lighthouse PATH is requesting **\$144,243** for the Teens. The renewal includes seven (7) single-bedroom units, and four (4) two-bedroom units, for a total of 11 subsidized units.

Teen participants are offered a safe place to live, comprehensive case management, health care, child care, individual and group counseling and a variety of life skills classes such as parenting, budgeting, and personal life management. All teen participants are required to complete their high school education. The PATH teen program provides a supportive place to live with wrap around services for pregnant and parenting teens that are often at odds with or completely shunned by their families. These young women can then learn how to take care of themselves and their children. The adult women with high risk pregnancies receive case management, child care, health care,

life skills classes including parenting, health care, and individual and group counseling. All clients are offered financial literacy classes, financial coaching, career development and job placement services.

Lighthouse PATH HUD Leasing Grant

Lighthouse Path is requesting **\$109,881** for the HUD Leasing Grant. This program is designed to reach those individuals who have physical or mental disabilities, and who have been homeless for more than a year or have experienced repeated episodes of homelessness (four or more episodes within a three-year period). Participants are provided with a housing orientation and they receive a leasing subsidy for the duration of their time within the Supportive Housing Program. The renewal includes nine (9) single-bedroom units, and one (1) two-bedroom units, for a total of 10 subsidized units.

Michigan Department of Health and Human Services

Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Shelter plus Care CMH- Community Housing Network

Michigan Department of Health (MDCH) is requesting a one-year renewal grant of **\$653,463** to continue the funding of 80 units of permanent supportive housing through the leasing of scattered-site rental units throughout Oakland County. Last year we consolidated grants to reduce administrative burden. MDCH provides rental assistance and access to supportive services to current and future program participants who are homeless and affected by severe and persistent mental illness and/or chronic substance abuse and/or living with AIDS/HIV and/or developmental disabilities. The renewal funding will be used to pay for rental subsidies, Housing Quality Standards (HQS) inspections, and supportive services (staff salary). Future program participants are individuals and families currently residing in emergency shelters, on the streets, or who are otherwise literally homeless and are referred to CHN by law enforcement officials, hospitals, or other service providers. Individuals who meet HUD's definition of being chronically homeless will be given preference for the program.

South Oakland Shelter (SOS) is requesting **\$350,046** to support the Chronic Homeless Leasing Assistance Program (CLAP) to subsidize thirty-two (32) one-bedroom scattered-site rental units in Oakland County. CLAP will offer a realistic path for individuals seeking shelter assistance who are chronically homeless with a disability, substance abuse history, and are connected and compliant with their mental health provider. SOS will give priority to chronically

cally homeless veterans. This program is relatively new and has been in operation for one year.

Chronic Homeless Leasing Assistance Program 2

South Oakland Shelter (SOS) is requesting **\$173,126** to support the Chronic Homeless Leasing Assistance Program (CLAP) to subsidize seventeen (17) scattered-site rental units in Oakland County. CLAP2 will offer a realistic path for individuals seeking shelter assistance who are chronically homeless with a disability, substance abuse history, and are connected and compliant with their mental health provider. SOS will give priority to chronically homeless veterans. This program is relatively new and has been in operation for one year.

South Oakland Shelter (SOS) is requesting **\$338,308** for a new project to subsidize seventeen (17) scattered-site rental units in Oakland County. ECHP will offer a realistic path for individuals seeking shelter assistance who are chronically homeless with a disability, substance abuse history, and are connected and compliant with their mental health provider. SOS will give priority to chronically homeless veterans.

Training and Treatment Innovations, Inc.

Housing Leasing Assistance #1

Training and Treatment Innovations (TTI) is requesting **\$524,906** for renewal of their existing Housing Leasing Assistance programs; homeless and chronically homeless individuals, with mental illness. Training and Treatment Innovations have been operating a Housing Leasing Assistance program for eight years. The consolidated grant will continue as Housing Leasing Assistance #1.

This renewal includes thirty-six (36) single-bedroom units, eight (8) two-bedroom units, and eight (8) three-bedroom units, for a total of 52 subsidized units. The renewal will continue to address priority needs such as: permanent supportive housing for persons and families that meet the definition of homeless and chronically homeless and housing and supportive services for persons with severe and persistent mental illness and/or persons who are dually diagnosed with substance abuse.
